## Minutes of the 2014 AGM of the West of England Thematic Society

Held at Buckfastleigh Town Hall on Saturday November 1<sup>st</sup> 2014. starting at 1415 hrs

**Apologies** – Mrs. M. Claydon (Chairman), Mrs. V. Wigmore, Mr. I. Hobbs.

**Minutes of the Previous Meeting.** – Had been previously circulated. There being no requests for changes, the minutes were accepted as a true record.

**Matters Arising** – None.

**Chairman's Report** – In the absence of the Chairman, the Vice Chairman made the following report.

*"Despite the fact we have had a reasonable year thanks to inputs from our various committee members, I feel it is time we need to take stock of who we are, what we are doing, and to look at what we wish to achieve for the future.*

*An organisation without a goal is not going very far, to this end you will note today's agenda is looking to address some of these issues.*

*Our 2014 Roadshow with its theme "Aspiration & Achievement" has been quite a show stopper and has really brought to most club members what thematic is all about. We will have a hard act to follow when we do the roadshow for 2016, so now is the time to begin putting a show together that will tell the story of thematics in a simple way that every club member will appreciate and understand.*

*The loss of London Dealers to our Autumn Meetings while a shame, it is not the end of the world and gives us an opportunity to get back to our roots and to be inspirational. Lets do it."*

**Secretary's Report** – The report of the Vice Chairman was reinforced along with the fact that our Roadshow had 13 bookings for the year with only two left to do. The groups Spring Meeting had seen two speakers a first for the group, both displays were well received.

**Treasurers Report** – The Treasurer presented a full set of accounts a copy of which is lodged with the Secretary as part of the proceedings. The group had done well through the year finishing with a slight surplus due in part to low speaker expenses for our Spring Meeting.

2015 Subscriptions – In view of our current financial state, it was recommended by the Treasurer, not to increase subscriptions this year.

## **THE WETS AGM 2014** by Martin Ellam

There was a poor attendance at the 2014 AGM and Autumn Meeting of the West of England Thematic Society, at Buckfastleigh Town Hall on 1st November 2014. The AGM was conducted by Vice Chairman Jim Wigmore ably supported by Secretary Sally Ellam and Treasurer Andrew Austen.

After acceptance of the previous minutes Vice chairman Jim Wigmore gave the Chairman's report in the absence of Mary Claydon. This was followed by the Secretary, Treasurer and WETS Newsletter Editor reports. The Treasurer indicated that in view of the sound financial position (*a Balance of £759.29*) there was no need to increase the Annual Subscription. This was accepted by the meeting.



The Newsletter Editor asked for more articles for the newsletter as this was our window to the world and was sent to the RPSL. He had also had requests to use some of the articles by ABPS. Mary Claydon stood down from the Chairman's position to care for husband Norman. It was proposed that in recognition of her outstanding service to thematic philately in the West of England a letter of thanks be sent and that she be made our Honorary President. This was unanimously agreed.

It was proposed that Jim Wigmore become Chairman, Martin Ellam Vice-chairman. Sally Ellam, Andrew Austen and Jim Wigmore, as newsletter editor, agreed to continue in post and all were voted in en bloc. The future of WETS was discussed at length and several ideas taken forward for development. It was suggested that the next venue be in the Exeter area. There being no further business the meeting was closed.



The business part of the meeting over, Tea and biscuits were produced while members viewed the competition entries. A raffle was arranged by Sally Ellam, here in discussion with David Roseveare, possibly on the finer points of French Philately. The draw was hilarious as once a member had won a prize a second win brought another redraw. Due to the very generous donation of prizes everyone went away with something.

The thematic competition was judged by Richard Wheeler and the WETS trophy awarded to Martin Ellam for his display of 'Diamonds'. The newly elected Chairman presented Martin with his certificate and The John Hilsdon trophy after Richard had explained why he liked the display and the reasons for his decision. The AGM threw up several points upon which to ponder and the afternoon for me was very gratifying now I have to work out what to put into next years WETS competition.





## THE TOWN OF NOAH'S GREAT GRANDSON by Jim Wigmore

Many years ago I was inspired by an article in Stamp Collecting written by the late Wilfred T. F. Castle with the title "Town of Noah's Great Grandson", its basis was a religious text reproduced right.

The article explained that topographer Dr Jack Goodwin had discovered some 71 alternative names for the town we now know as Larnaca a name that only appears after 1600AD.

"Now these are the generations of the sons of Noah, Shem, Ham and Japheth: and unto them were sons after the Flood. Of the sons of Japheth....Javan. And of the sons Javan ....KITTIM"  
GENESIS 6-8



The article explained the town was the centre of one of the original Ten Kingdoms that made up the Island of Cyprus. One of its sons Lazarus was a follower of Jesus and he returned to CITIUM (as it was then known by the Romans) and became Bishop, after his death the Church of St Lazarus (shown left) was built over the tomb, this church had the first campanile in the island.

All very well I hear you say "but where is the inspiration in all that", it is in the stamps issued by Cyprus that can be linked back to these events. It is all this that got me thinking that with such an amazing story the best way of arranging and showing this story was thematically.

Taking this a step further and looking at all the stories relating to the island was to lead to "Aphrodites Island" Zino of Kitium (336-274BC)



Larnaca was the place chosen by the British to land and set up the first British Post Office in Cyprus. They introduced British stamps overprinted CYPRUS to be cancelled using the 942 cancel. The miniature sheet shown above gives a feel as to conditions at this time. The troubles in the island have led to the creation of a main airport at Larnaca, it may well be true that Noah sailed the waters in an Ark, but his descendants now sail the skies in planes.
